Your organization has a proud history of nurturing Greek and Hellenic cultural activities. That is why we are submitting two books published by Artemis Arrow Books, LLC, a Greek-American publisher, for your consideration:

1. *The Miseries of Occupation: A Child Survivor Remembers* an English language title translated from Greek; and
2. "ΠΕΡΑ ΑΠ' ΤΟΥΣ ΟΡΙΖΟΝΤΕΣ" (Beyond the Horizons), a Greek language title.

Synopses

Miseries of Occupation is a memoir of my father's childhood growing up in Greece during the Nazi occupation and the civil war that followed. It is told from his point-of-view as a young boy who was bewildered by the forces swirling around our small village in the Peloponnese when the Nazis occupied Greece.

His chief goal was to survive this unrelenting turmoil. When he was 11, an even bigger event occurred. His father, Leonidas, was taken from his family at gunpoint by Greek Nazi collaborators and imprisoned.

From that moment on, he was on a mission to reunite with his father, and to understand how he came to be arrested.



He quickly learned, however, he had more to fear from his closest family members – namely, his uncle and grandmother – than even the Nazis!

The opening chapter introduces the reader to his life in the small village of Ziria at age eight before the Nazi occupation. The final chapters resolves his quest to find his father and the reader finds out how he came to be captured, charged, tried in a mock court, and ultimately executed.

Beyond the Horizons is narrated by Jason, who is part adventurer and part historian like the ancient Greek historian Pausanias.

Starting in Constantinople, the Queen of the Bosphorus, our narrator travels 25,000 miles around the globe searching for the meaning of civilization both ancient and modern.

The reader will follow Jason from the Mediterranean and Asia Minor to beyond the Arctic Circle and to the American Pacific Northwest. He tells of the vast corruption that exists in political systems and exposes how is treated as a migrant in new lands.

Along the way, Jason gives testimony to vital Greek holocaust-related history that occurred in Asia Minor where two million Hellenes died.

Both of these titles have wide appeal for readers of all ages but they are especially engaging for anyone who seeks a better understanding of the historical context of Greece both during and after the Second World War.

We hope your organization might consider, upon reviewing our books, any one of the following ways to engage with the author and these titles:
